HOME CARE 101

NSAP's Home Care Program has been around in some fashion since our founding as a nonprofit in 2003. Volunteers helped elders with housekeeping, grocery shopping or other tasks they needed assistance with. In 2019, NSAP sought and received a 245D waiver license, a pivotal step in developing our existing home care program.



As part of our current program, many elders commonly receive housekeeping services (cleaning bathroom, kitchen, mopping and vacuuming), along with companionship and friendly visits. During this time, people often sign up for Meals on Wheels, a program through Arrowhead Economic Opportunity Agency. NSAP home care services are performed by our home health aides (HHA)—they are compassionate, highly skilled and come with exemplary experience. All HHA's have passed background checks prior to starting their position.

To receive home care services through NSAP, folks schedule an assessment with our Home Care Manager involving either a home visit or office visit to discuss what help might be needed. It usually takes about a week from the initial discussion until the HHA makes her first visit. Visits are scheduled out a month at a time by our Service Coordinator, and clients receive an invoice at the beginning of the month for the services rendered during the previous month. Elders share in the cost of home care services based on their monthly income and the type of services being performed.

Added services can include: assistance with laundry, running errands, grocery shopping, or washing inside windows. Assistance with personal cares (bathing/grooming) or setting up medications will require added responsibility for the home health aide and results in a higher cost for services. Basic costs for services at the highest income can range from \$25-40/hr. Individuals with a very low income could receive housekeeping for \$6.25/hour. Again, the services cost range varies based on the client's monthly income.

COST SHARING

A core value of North Shore Area Partners has always been to provide assistance to all elders regardless of their financial circumstances. The most important thing to us is that each person receives the support they need to maintain their health and quality of life. We trust that our services will be valued, and that individuals and their family members will contribute as they are able, so that we can continue to offer these services to our community.

There are many direct and indirect costs associated with providing any service, whether done by a volunteer (such as transportation) or by an employee (such as licensed home care). These include office coverage, insurance, training, supervision, scheduling, and mileage reimbursement. NSAP receives a variety of grants that help cover our expenses, but the demand on those resources is increasing. Some grantors require that we request cost-sharing from our clients to encourage long-term financial sustainability.

As a guideline, NSAP offers suggested cost share amounts using a sliding scale fee based on household income. However, it is up to each client to determine what makes sense in their own situation. We will never deny services solely because of the inability or unwillingness to pay. We want each individual to receive the care they need to live well at home, and we will do everything we can to help make that possible.

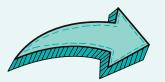
Come Support NSAP!

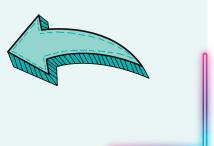

COMPANION PETS

What's new in the Caregiver Support Program at North Shore Area Partners? Puppy and Kitty are new! NSAP's Caregiver Support Program received two, JOY FOR ALL Companion Pets from the MN Board of Aging back in February—a cat with silver fur and white mitts, and a golden retriever puppy. JOY FOR ALL Companion Pets are robotic (battery-operated) animals designed to bring comfort, companionship, and fun to seniors.

Originally designed by Hasbro (home of NERF, Monopoly, GI Joe, and much more!) as a way to inspire play and fun for older adults, JOY FOR ALL Companion Pets are now used in many settings as an alternative to traditional pet therapy. For example, companion pets have been shown to alleviate feelings of loneliness and isolation for elderly people living by themselves. Companion pets have also helped people living with dementia find comfort by helping them calm themselves and create a sense of well-being. Research shows that JOY FOR ALL Companion Pets can improve cognition, quality of care, and reduce caregiver burden for people living with Alzheimer's Disease and other forms of dementia.

NSAP's companion cat, Kitty, and companion dog, Puppy, are available for check-out if you'd like to take them home for a visit. As you can imagine, I have thoroughly enjoyed working with the two pets, and the community response to them has been extremely positive. Kitty spent two weeks with a local family (who now have a JOY FOR ALL cat of their own), and at least one local caregiver has purchased a companion pet for their aging parent after hearing about and seeing the animals here at NSAP.
